This information is held on a password-protected computer maintained by the Secretary, Ghalib Al-Nasser, Evenstar, Pinkuah Lane, Pentlow, Essex, CO10 7JW, England. Email ghalib.alnasser@gmail.com, Tel. +44 (0)1787 282332. The other members of the NCA who are permitted access to the personal information are the Officers of the committee.

In no circumstances will the information on the NCA Database be sold or passed on to outsiders. It will be used solely for the purposes of keeping NCA members informed of its activities and for the distribution of its Newsletters and Show material. Every member has the right to have their personal information amended or removed from the database. Such information has in the past been removed when a member has resigned, declined to pay their subscription or has deceased. It is intended that this practice will continue.
